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For Application: Owner's name, current mailing address & telephone number OWTS Contractor – Must be licensed with Fremont County as an Installer. Evidence of Water – Water bill or well test report. Fremont County Permit Fees, Use Tax, & Colorado Surcharge must be paid by applicant at time of submittal.
Site & Soil Evaluation & Design: (2 Copies) The site and soil evaluation shall be provided by a Registered Professional Engineer or Competent Technician: It shall consist of: • Preliminary investigation; · Property Information · Fremont County Public Health Agency records · Published site information · Location of physical features, on and off the property that will require setbacks. · Preliminary soil treatment are size estimate based on information on existing or planned facility and Fremont County regulations · Any additional information that may be useful to the specific evaluation as available. • Reconnaissance; · Landscape position; · Topography; · Vegetation;
 ✓ Vegetation; ✓ Natural & cultural features; and ✓ Current & historic land use. Detailed soil investigation; and ✓ 2 Profile Holes Report and site plan. ✓ A Written Report shall describe the results of the preliminary investigation, reconnaissance, and detailed evaluations. ✓ Lot size, absorption area, tank size, number of bedrooms ✓ Type/Use of building – Dwelling, Commercial, Factory, etc. All engineering documents must have the construction address listed with the Engineers wet stamp, signed and dated; or the Competent Technicians original signature and date. Specific construction techniques designed by a registered professional engineer if soil conditions dictate special construction.

Engineer must inspect & approve to Fremont County any engineer designed system installation prior

to county inspection being conducted. System & tank need to be uncovered for all inspections. Address must be posted on property visible from a public roadway at time inspection is called for.
